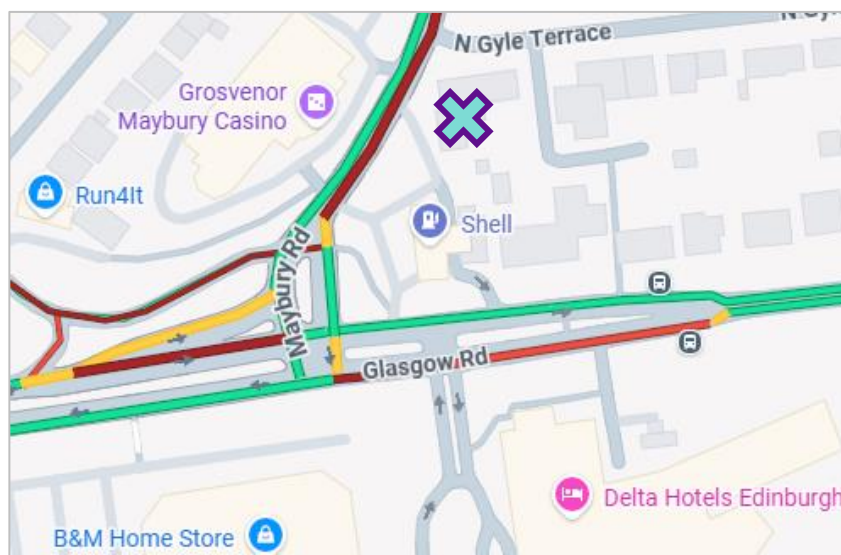

By train or tram

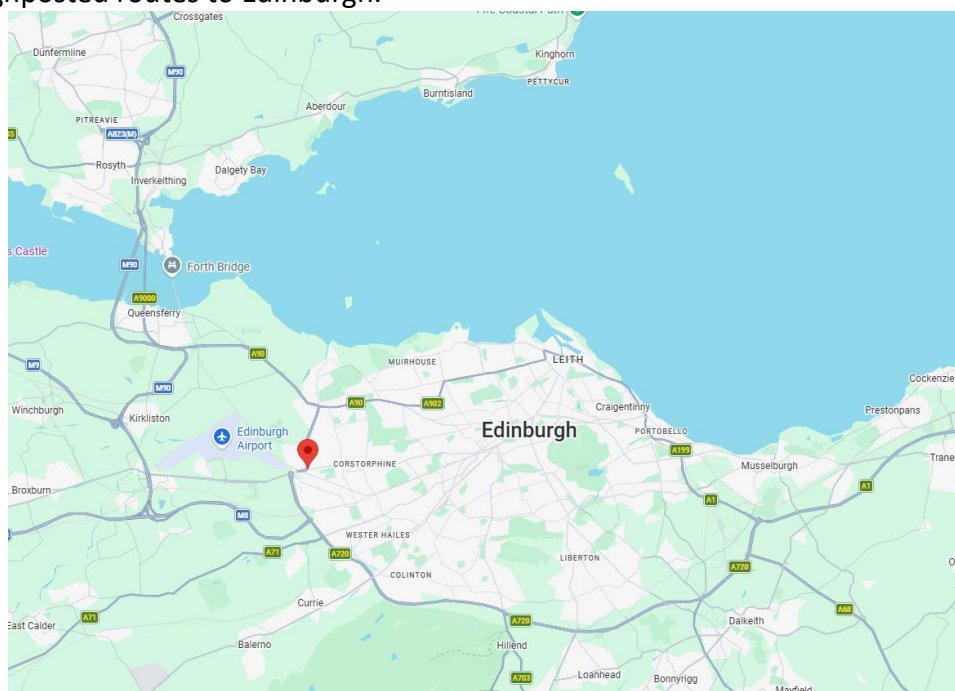
The nearest station/stop is Edinburgh Gateway and is accessible from the city centre and Edinburgh airport. To check journey times visit www.scotrail.co.uk/plan-your-journey/timetables (trains) or <http://edinburghtrams.com/> (trams)

The National Centre is a short 5-10 minute walk from Edinburgh Gateway:

By car - Take signposted routes to Edinburgh.



If approaching from the north – take the M90 southbound, then merge on to the M9. At jct 1 take the exit for Edinburgh Airport, continue until on Glasgow Road.

If approaching from the west – take the M8 to join the A720 heading north. At the roundabout at the A8, take the 3rd exit to join Glasgow Road.

If approaching from the east – take the A1 or A68 to the A720 westbound. Continue to the end of the A720. At the roundabout at the A8, take the 3rd exit to join Glasgow Road.

If approaching from the south -take the A7, A701/2/3 to the A720 westbound. Continue to the end of the A720. At the roundabout at the A8, take the 3rd exit to join Glasgow Road.

From Glasgow Road turn left on to Marbury Road, then right on to North Gyle Terrace. The entrance is to the rear of the building.

Parking is plentiful at and around the building. Free on street parking is available at North Gyle Terrace and North Gyle Grove, behind the Maybury Casino, West Craigs Crescent, and West Craigs Avenue. There are no time restrictions or payment needed at the B&M store on Glasgow Road. (All parking is at the drivers own risk – we cannot be held responsible for damage to vehicles or fines if they occur).

Spaces at the National Centre can sometimes be booked for visitors if there is availability or accessibility requirements – email feedback@alzscot.org or contact your group organiser.

By bus – Lothian Buses have extensive routes throughout the city. Their journey planner can be used to find the quickest route - <https://www.lothianbuses.com/>

The Maybury stop is closest and serves bus no. 17, 31, 100 Airlink, N18, X18, X19, X38 & X39.

Accessibility

Once inside the building's main entrance, press the intercom to alert the receptionist who will assist you. The building is fully dementia friendly and we welcome any suggestions for improvement.

The building covers three floor accessible via stairs or lift. Toilets (including disabled access) are available on every floor.

Your safety in the building

There is a scheduled test conducted weekly every Friday at 9.30am.

If the fire alarm sounds continually, please exit the building by following the fire exit signs lit up in green. Please do not use the lift in the event of a fire. There is an additional fire escape from the Lounge area on the ground floor.

If not on the ground floor, exit via stairwell if safe and clear. If the stairwell is compromised (fire, smoke, gas, fumes etc), then take shelter in a room with (fire) doors closed and raise the alarm if need be.

If you require assistance in the event of an evacuation, please notify a member of Alzheimer Scotland staff when you arrive and a Personal Emergency Evacuation Plan will be completed.

The muster point is situated near the entrance to our car park, and you will be directed there and assisted by our fire wardens.

Smoking is not permitted within the premises - there is a designated smoking area directly opposite the main entrance adjacent to the small white building.
