We work to improve the care and support that people receive. Established in 2004, we inform policy, raise awareness and support improvements in services. We aim to make sure that the experiences of people with neurological conditions – and those around them – are recognised.

We launched our first campaign during Brain Awareness Week 2022, with over 1000 social media interactions
